

# NORTH LONDONDERRY TOWNSHIP

## BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

August 21, 2023

A public hearing was called to order on August 21, 2023 at 7:30 p.m. by Chairman Ronald Fouché in the Township Municipal Building. Present were Supervisors Barry Riegle and William Buckfelder, Solicitor Andrew Morrow, Manager Michael Booth, Assistant Manager Kristopher Troup, Chief Kevin Snyder, and Secretary/Treasurer Lisa Daubert. Two (2) visitors were present. The purpose of the hearing was to receive comments or questions from the public about and before the possible action on accepting proposed Resolution No. 08-21-2023 (Agriculture Security Area - Update).

Assistant Manager Kristopher Troup provided a synopsis of the proposed resolution. Chairman Ronald Fouché asked the public for any comments regarding the proposed Resolution. No comments were received.

The hearing was declared closed at 7:32 p.m.

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Immediately following the public hearing, Chairman Fouché called the regular meeting of the North Londonderry Township Board of Supervisors to order.

Chairman Fouché called for questions or comments from the public on the agenda items for this meeting. None were received.

Minutes from the previous meeting, July 17, 2023 were approved as presented on motion by Riegle, seconded by Buckfelder. All in favor.

The Treasurer's Report for period ending July 31, 2023 was accepted as presented. All in favor.

The Police Report for July 2023 was accepted as presented. All in favor. Chief Kevin Snyder noted the Police Report will be placed on the Township's website and a copy will be placed in the Police Department's lobby for public viewing.

Manager Michael Booth reported the Planning Commission did not meet on August 21, 2023. No business was necessary.

Invoices were approved as presented on motion by Buckfelder, seconded by

Riegle. All in favor.

Resolution No. 08-21-2023 (Agriculture Security Area - Update) was adopted on motion by Riegle, seconded by Buckfelder. All in favor.

Manager Booth presented a lease agreement with the County of Lebanon to build a public safety radio system tower and related structures on Township property along with a right-of-way access to the site. The County will have nine (9) tower sites throughout the County. On motion by Buckfelder, seconded by Riegle, the Supervisors approved the signing of the public safety radio system tower lease agreement with the County. All in favor.

Deborah Buckfelder, Township Representative – Palmyra Public Library Board submitted a monthly report and also noted the building HVAC will be upgraded in September. Mrs. Buckfelder remarked the shed where donated books are stored has been re-shingled. A copy of the report is on file for public viewing.

A request was made to close Harnish Street from West Elm Street to Pajabon Drive for a block party on September 3, 2023. On motion by Riegle, seconded by Buckfelder, the Supervisors approved the closing of Harnish Street between West Elm Street and Pajabon Drive from 12:00 noon to 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, September 3, 2023. All in favor.

There being no other business, the meeting adjourned at 7:41 p.m.
