

NORTH LONDONDERRY TOWNSHIP

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

May 20, 2024

The regular meeting of the North Londonderry Township Board of Supervisors was called to order at 7:30 p.m. on May 20, 2024 by Chairman Ronald Fouché in the Township Municipal Building. Others attending were Supervisors Barry Riegle and William Buckfelder, Solicitor Andrew Morrow, Manager Michael Booth, Assistant Manager Kristopher Troup, Chief Kevin Snyder, and Secretary/Treasurer Lisa Daubert. Five (5) visitors were present.

Chairman Fouché called for questions or comments from the public on the agenda items for this meeting. None were received.

Minutes from the previous meeting, April 15, 2024 were approved as presented on motion by Riegle, seconded by Buckfelder. All in favor.

The Treasurer's Report for period ending April 30, 2024 were accepted as presented. All in favor.

The Police Report for April 2024 was accepted as presented. All in favor. Chief Kevin Snyder noted the Police Reports have been placed on the Township's website and copies were placed in the Police Department's lobby for public viewing.

Manager Michael Booth reported the Planning Commission met on May 20, 2024. The Planners recommended three (3) ordinance changes to the Township Supervisors for consideration.

Invoices were approved as presented on motion by Buckfelder, seconded by Riegle. All in favor.

Resolution No. 05-20-2024 (America250PA) was adopted on motion by Riegle, seconded by Buckfelder. All in favor.

The Supervisors were asked to sign a Letter of Intent for the Citizen's Fire Company No. 1 in requesting assistance to conduct a feasibility study regarding the creation of a regional fire department. On motion by Buckfelder, seconded by Riegle, the Supervisors instructed Chairman Fouché to sign the Letter of Intent for submission to the Governor's Center for Local Government Services (DCED) on behalf of the Citizen's Fire Company No. 1. All in favor.

Deborah Buckfelder, Township Representative – Palmyra Public Library Board submitted a monthly report noting the book sale will be held July 13 – 18, 2024. A copy is on file for public viewing.

Supervisor Barry Riegle spoke of his time as a Township Supervisor and submitted his resignation due to health reasons. He thanked Supervisors Fouché and Buckfelder for their comradery and dedication to the Township. On motion by Buckfelder, seconded by Fouché, the Supervisors accepted the resignation of Barry D. Riegle. All in favor.

Supervisor Buckfelder recommended James E. Hartman to replace Mr. Riegle as Township Supervisor. On motion by Buckfelder, seconded by Fouché, the Supervisors appointed James E. Hartman as Township Supervisor to fill the vacancy until such time as the need for election. All in favor.

Mark Panassow, Palmyra Area Recreation & Parks Commission Vice-Chairman, was present to thank Barry Riegle for his years of service and dedication to the communities.

There being no other business, the meeting adjourned at 7:47 p.m.
