

NORTH LONDONDERRY TOWNSHIP

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

August 19, 2024

A public hearing was called to order on August 19, 2024 at 7:30 p.m. by Chairman Ronald Fouché in the Township Municipal Building. Present were Supervisors William Buckfelder and James Hartman, Solicitor Andrew Morrow, Manager Michael Booth, Assistant Manager Kristopher Troup, Chief Kevin Snyder, and Secretary/Treasurer Lisa Daubert. Five (5) visitors were present. The purpose of the hearing was to receive comments or questions from the public about and before the possible action on accepting proposed Ordinance No. 201 (Vehicles/Traffic). The Supervisors also conducted a public hearing regarding the Verizon Cable Franchise Agreement to receive comments from residents. Ordinance No. 202 (Verizon Cable Franchise Agreement) will be up for adoption at the September 16, 2024 regular meeting.

The hearings were declared closed at 7:38 p.m.

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Immediately following the public hearing, Chairman Fouché called the regular meeting of the North Londonderry Township Board of Supervisors to order.

Chairman Fouché called for questions or comments from the public on the agenda items for this meeting. None were received.

Minutes from the previous meeting, July 15, 2024 were approved as presented on motion by Hartman, seconded by Buckfelder. All in favor.

The Treasurer's Report for period ending July 31, 2024 was accepted as presented. All in favor.

The Police Report for July 2024 was accepted as presented. All in favor. Chief Kevin Snyder noted the Police Reports have been placed on the Township's website and copies were placed in the Police Department's lobby for public viewing.

Chairman Fouché reported the Planning Commission did not meet on August 19, 2024. No business was necessary.

On motion by Buckfelder, seconded by Hartman, the Supervisors made the following appointment. All in favor.

Invoices were approved as presented on motion by Hartman, seconded by Buckfelder. All in favor.

Ordinance No. 201 (Vehicles/Traffic) was adopted on motion by Buckfelder, seconded by Hartman. All in favor.

Deborah Buckfelder, Township Representative – Palmyra Public Library Board submitted a monthly report. A copy is on file for public viewing. Mrs. Buckfelder noted the Library had a record-breaking book sale - \$15,236.

A letter requesting to close the northwest end of Pembroke Lane for a block party on Sunday, September 1, 2024 was received. On motion by Hartman, seconded by Buckfelder, the Supervisors approved the closing of the northwest end of Pembroke Lane from 2:00 p.m. to sunset on Sunday, September 1, 2024. All in favor.

Gary Young and Stephen Meyer, residents of Park Drive were present and requested the Township assist with a weed-overgrown property. The property has not been taken care of for years and unwanted growth is affecting the adjacent properties. Chief Snyder noted a letter of compliance has been sent to the property owner. He noted the ordinance needs an update. Solicitor Morrow stated the ordinance would be reviewed and updated according; utilizing and referencing the State laws.

There being no other business, the meeting adjourned at 8:10 p.m.
