
# Calls for Service – Monthly Trend (YTD)

# Training & Admin Updates



## Training

- **Corporal Tim Zechman completed the Police Supervisory In-Service Training (POSIT) program, a five-day course focused on first-line supervisory leadership, legal responsibilities, personnel management, and liability awareness. The training emphasized situational leadership, performance evaluation, coaching strategies, and ethical supervisory practices.**

## Administrative / Staffing Updates

- **The department advanced two officer candidates through the hiring process and placed them into the Reading Police Academy on January 12, 2026.**
- **Chief Kevin Snyder retired on January 12, 2026, following 24 years of service as Chief of Police. As part of a leadership transition, the department promoted Tim Zechman from Patrolman to Corporal, Skylar Snyder from Corporal to Lieutenant, and Tom Hentz from Sergeant to Chief of Police.**
- **The department began a facility modernization project to update offices and work areas within the police station, originally constructed in 1996. The Township Highway Department is completing much of the labor to help control project costs, with outside vendors providing furniture and flooring.**
