How can I make sure my pile is collected?

- Branches are between 1 and 3 inches thick.
- Branches are generated by my routine maintenance of trees, not by a business or an occasional heavy trimming.
- My pile is lined up with cut ends at the edge of my property (see diagram); not in the street and as of 7:00 a.m. on collection day.
- My pile consists of branches and no other waste materials, are not bound by string nor tarped.

Crews will travel throughout the Township servicing residents roadside with chipping equipment. Once past, they will not return until the next month. Please take notice and trim branches hanging less than 14 feet above a roadway, less than 8 feet above a walkway and any that may be covering a road sign.

road projects so be diligent about removing them when not in use.
