

NORTH LONDONDERRY TOWNSHIP

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

July 20, 2026

The regular meeting of the North Londonderry Township Board of Supervisors was called to order at 7:00 p.m. on July 20, 2026 by Chairman William Buckfelder in the Township Municipal Building. Others attending were Supervisors James Hartman and Michael Salvo, Solicitor Andrew Morrow, Assistant Manager Kristopher Troup, Chief Thomas Hentz, and Secretary/Treasurer Lisa Daubert. Five (5) visitors were present.

Chairman William Buckfelder called for questions or comments from the public on the agenda items for this meeting. Solicitor Andrew Morrow and Assistant Manager Kristopher Troup clarified agenda item VII(b) under New Business stating they have researched and developed draft Data Center regulations. The draft regulations will be publicly introduced and discussed at the Township Planning Commission meeting on August 17, 2026 at 6:30 p.m.

Chief Thomas Hentz presented two (2) new officers to the Township for acceptance; Jeremy L. Cassel and Zachary R. Hertzog. Chairman Buckfelder administered the official Oath of Office to the new officers before the Township's Board, family and friends. Family members officially pinned the new Officers with their badges. On behalf of the community and the Supervisors, Chairman Buckfelder welcomed the new officers to the staff of the North Londonderry Township Police Department. Chief Hentz spoke of the two (2) officers' recent history; noting their graduation from the Reading Police Academy on June 26th and the high scores both officers received on the Municipal Police Officers Education & Training Commission (MPOETC) certification test.

Minutes from the previous meeting, June 15, 2026 were approved with corrections to the wording of the King Subdivision Plan Sewage Facilities Planning Module information on motion by Hartman, seconded by Salvo. All in favor.

The Treasurer's Report for period ending June 30, 2026 was accepted as presented on motion by Hartman, seconded by Salvo. All in favor.

The Police Report for June 2026 was accepted as presented on motion by Hartman, seconded by Salvo. All in favor. Chief Hentz noted the Police Reports have been placed on the Township's website and a copy was placed in the Police Department's lobby for public viewing.

Assistant Manager Troup reported the Planning Commission did not meet on July 20, 2026.

Invoices were approved as presented on motion by Hartman, seconded by Salvo. All in favor.

The Supervisors reviewed the bids for the 2026-2027 Road Salt – Sodium Chloride Contract. As recommended by Assistant Manager Troup, a motion was made by Salvo, seconded by Hartman to accept the bid received from Eastern Salt Company, Inc. for a bid price of \$92.82/Ton. All in favor.

A letter requesting to close the northwest end of Pembroke Lane for a block party on Saturday, August 29, 2026 was received. On motion by Hartman, seconded by Salvo, the Supervisors approved the closing of the northwest end of Pembroke Lane from 2:00 p.m. to sunset on Saturday, August 29, 2026. All in favor.

A letter requesting to close Harnish Street from West Elm Street to Pajabon Drive for a block party on Sunday, September 6, 2026 was received. On motion by Salvo, seconded by Hartman, the Supervisors approved the closing of Harnish Street between West Elm Street and Pajabon Drive from 2:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Sunday, September 6, 2026. All in favor.

A letter requesting the use of the Township Trails from the Palmyra Area High School Mini-THON Gold Out organization for a 5K Fundraiser event to raise money for pediatric cancer on Monday, September 7, 2026 (Labor Day) from 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon was received. On motion by Salvo, seconded by Hartman, the Supervisors approved the use of the Township Trails on Monday, September 7, 2026 (Labor Day) from 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon. All in favor.

Deborah Buckfelder, Township Representative – Palmyra Public Library Board submitted a monthly report. A copy is on file for public viewing. Mrs. Buckfelder noted the official results of the annual book sale have not been received as of this date. She thanked all who were involved in the organization of a successful event.

Supervisor Hartman and Attorney Morrow – Township representatives to the Palmyra Park and Recreation Commission noted the Commission is looking into the permitting system for use of the Ridge Road Complex. Upon recent events and tournament use of the fields, the Commission has received complaints regarding traffic. Also received, were complaints regarding the abundance of dust emitted from the road leading into the facility due to the dry weather. A solution will be sought.

Carol Ann Valerio, resident of Cambridge Court, was present to thank Roadmaster John Dubbs and Assistant Manager Troup for their help in the repair of a sinkhole near her property. She also thanked Emily Conrad for the kindness shown when calling the Township Office.

There being no other business, the meeting adjourned at 7:26 p.m.
