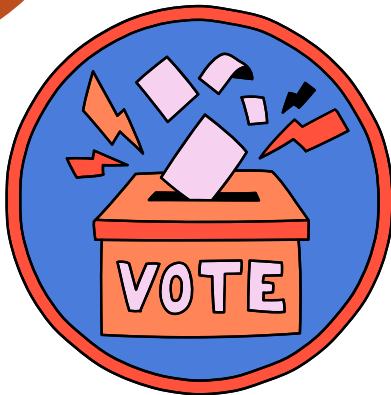

FINAL CHIPPING DAY

The Township's monthly chipping program will continue through **October 5th**, on the first Monday each month, except November and December. To participate, branches must be in your yard along the curb by **7:00 a.m.** on collection day.

Chipping will **resume January 4th**, with an extra pickup on January 18th. Christmas trees will be accepted on any scheduled collection day. Remove **ALL** decorations prior to placing trees curbside.

Check your mailbox in the new year for all the chipping dates set for 2027!



COMPOST CARDS EXPIRE

Are you a member of our compost facility? Don't throw away your key card! Although access will expire on **December 31st**, cards can be renewed as soon as January 4th. Replacement cards are \$10. The fee for 2027 will remain at \$35.

KEEP FIRE HYDRANTS CLEAR

- Clear a zone of **3 feet** on all sides of the hydrant.
- **Clear a path** from the hydrant to the street.
- **Remove** any **snow** and **ice** piled on top.

These actions will improve response times of firefighters accessing this critical infrastructure in an emergency.

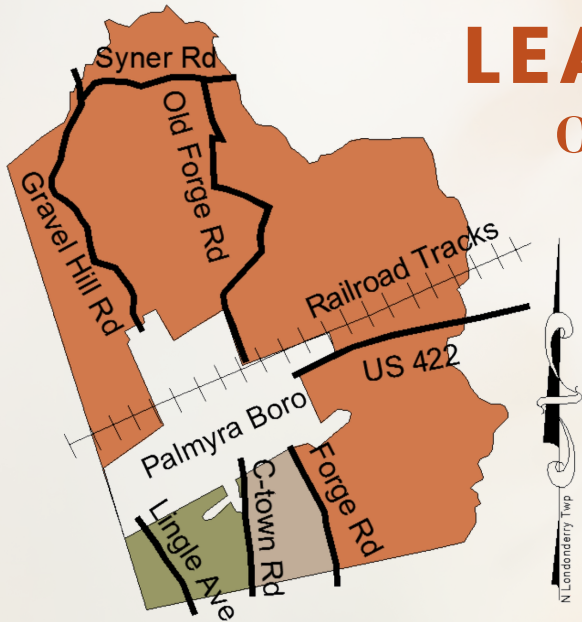

Fall LEAF COLLECTION

October 12 to December 11



Township Road crews will collect leaves on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from October 12th to December 11th, as indicated on the map. Leaves should be placed in long, narrow piles in the street, along the curb line by **7:00 a.m.** on collection day.

Residents without a curb should keep them on the property, but as close to the roadway as possible. The piles should be no more than **4 feet wide** and remain at least **15 feet from obstructions** (e.g. parked cars, intersections, and basketball nets).

FOR THE SAFETY OF OUR CREW

Services **cannot** be conducted on **Gravel Hill Road, Route 422, or South Forge Road** from *Park Dr.* south to the Township line. Additionally, collection cannot be performed on any streets **not dedicated** to the Township.

Monday pickup

Residents **north** of Route 422 &

Residents **south** of Route 422, *east of S. Forge Rd.*

Wednesday pickup

Residents **south** of Route 422,

between *S. Forge Rd. & Campbelltown Rd.*

Friday pickup

Residents **south** of Route 422,

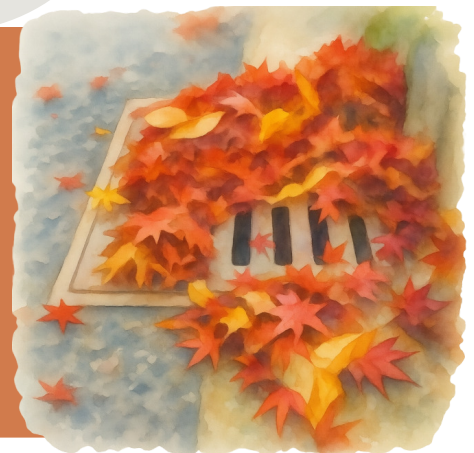
west of Campbelltown Rd.

PLEASE NOTE: Our crews work diligently to provide this service on the scheduled day. However, **weather, volume of leaves, and equipment breakdowns may cause a delay.** When crews are unable to collect on the scheduled day, every effort is made to collect the following day. Residents may see trucks working ahead, (to keep up with collection demand or before an upcoming rain, etc.). They will always return on your scheduled day. However, once a street is serviced that day, crews will not return until the following week.



FREE THE STORM DRAINS

When placing your leaves in the street for collection, **leave a few inches** between your leaf pile and curb to allow rainwater to flow to drains. Residents near storm drains should help by **keeping grates clear** to prevent flooding. Leaves collected over a storm drain can be raked into a pile with other leaves for collection.

BUSINESS RECYCLING CONTRIBUTES TO MUNICIPAL GRANTS

Township Ordinance requires all properties, including commercial businesses to separate and collect recyclable materials for disposal. These materials would be:

- Aluminum cans
- Office paper and corrugated cardboard
- Yard Waste & Leaves
- Clear, green & brown glass bottles and jars
- Steel & Bimetal Cans
- # 1 & # 2 plastic containers
- Newspaper

This program not only reduces landfill waste but lowers the operational expense for curbside services, compost facility, and collection containers. Higher recycling rates maximize the opportunity for us to receive more state funding to support our community!
